NOTICE OF VIOLATION, WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS ORDER NO. R8-2016-0026 FOR THE CITY OF BEAUMONT SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT NO. 1, 417 4th STREET, BBEAUMONT, CALIFORNIA (NPDES NO. CA33101001)

Dear Ms. Gibbs:

The City of Beaumont (City) owns the Beaumont Wastewater Treatment Plant (Facility), a tertiary treatment facility located in the southern portion of the City. Waste discharge requirements, including reporting requirements for the Facility are specified in Order No. R8-2015-0026, NPDES No. CA0105376 (Order). The Order stated that the Facility's design and permitted flow is 4 million gallons per day.

In our November 20, 2015 letter (enclosed) we reminded you of the standard provision in Section VI.A.15 of the Order that requires the City of Beaumont to file a written report with the Regional Board within ninety (90) days after the average dry-weather waste flow for any month equals or exceeds 75 percent of the design capacity of the waste treatment and/or disposal facilities. A report transmittal letter signed by the senior administrative officer must include a certification that the policymaking body is adequately informed in the matter.

To date, we have not received the required report. The City has violated and continues to violate reporting requirements specified in Section VI.A.15 of the Order.

Further, we understand that the current capacity of the plant does not meet the current growth of the City and immediate repairs and maintenance are required at the Facility. By not addressing necessary repairs and maintenance and the lack of planning for adequate treatment capacity, the City also threatens to violate discharge prohibitions specified in Section III of the Order.

The City is required to submit the required report no later than May 19, 2016. Failure to submit the requested information may result in enforcement action, including civil

monetary penalties pursuant to Water Code section 13385 of up to \$10,000 for each day of violation. Please note that issuance of this notice does not preclude further enforcement action in this matter.

CAPACITY REPORTING REQUIREMENT UNDER THE WASTE DISCHARGE AND WATER RECLAMATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CITY OF BEAUMONT, BEAUMONT WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT, ORDER NO. R8-2015-0026, NPDES NO. CA0105376

Dear Mr. Warsinski:

We recently became aware that the City of Beaumont's wastewater treatment plant, permitted under Order No. R8-2015-0026, NPDES No. CA0105376 (Order) is currently at 75 percent capacity.

This is to remind you of the standard provision in Section VI.A.15 of the Order that requires the City of Beaumont to file a written report with the Regional Board within ninety (90) days after the average dry-weather waste flow for any month equals or exceeds 75 percent of the design capacity of the waste treatment and/or disposal facilities. A report transmittal letter signed by the senior administrative officer must include a certification that the policymaking body is adequately informed in the matter. The aforementioned provision further states that the report must include the following:

- a. Average daily flow for the month, the date on which instantaneous peak flow occurred, the rate of that peak flow, and the total flow for the day.
- b. The Discharger's best estimate of when the average daily dry-weather flow rate will equal or exceed the design capacity of the treatment and/or disposal facilities.
- c. The Discharger's intended schedule for studies, design, and/or other steps needed to provide additional capacity for the waste treatment and/or disposal facilities before the waste flow rate equals the capacity of present units.

Additionally, insufficient design capacity caused by the failure to accommodate growth, inflow and infiltration and lack of proper operation and maintenance, among other factors, are major causes of sanitary sewer overflows. Our October 16, 2015 letter (enclosed) to sewage collection system owners and operators, including the City of

Beaumont, reminded you of your responsibilities under the State Water Resources Control Board Order No. 2006-0003-DWQ in light of the predicted severe El Nino conditions. The City of Beaumont is required to comply with the requirements of both permits.

Subject: Collection System Preparation for Anticipated 2015-2016 El Nino Rainy Season

The Santa Ana Regional Water Quality Control Board (Santa Ana Regional Board) is sending you this courtesy reminder to prepare your sanitary sewer collection system for the 2015–2016 rainy season.

As you know, municipalities and other public entities that own and operate a sewage collection system within the Santa Ana Regional Board jurisdiction (Region) are regulated under the Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) for Sanitary Sewer System, Order No. 2006-0003- DWQ¹ (General Order). The General Order prohibits the discharge of untreated or partially treated wastewater to the waters of the United States. The General Order also requires the development and implementation of sanitary sewer management plans (SSMPs) that contain requirements for operation and maintenance of collection systems and for reporting and mitigating sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs). Proper collection system operation and maintenance includes the periodic or continuing process to identify problems including proactive identification and elimination of inflow and infiltration and structural vulnerabilities to prevent or minimize SSOs during rain events.

For months, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) has been predicting that El Nino, a condition that occurs when a band of warm ocean water develops in the Pacific Ocean that causes changes in rainfall, will continue through the Northern Hemisphere during the winter of 2015-2016. As with past El Nino years, this weather pattern has the potential to produce higher than average rainfall amounts in the Region.

Since the prediction for El Nino has been anticipated for quite some time, the Regional Board is notifying all Enrollees in the Region to ensure that necessary actions to prevent SSOs during the rainy season has been taken. You are reminded that failure to demonstrate that adequate preventative measures were taken that could have minimized or prevented a known or otherwise anticipated wet weather problem that resulted in an SSO may result in civil monetary penalties pursuant to the California Water Code.
